There will be lots of opportunities over the coming months for you to come into school, so please make a point of reading the monthly newsletters that come out for one off events and refer to the calendar on our website for regular clubs etc.

Our website also contains a host of general and specific information about the curriculum, policies, routines and events, however if you can't find what you are looking for, the office staff will be able to point you in the right direction.

Parent homework this month

We are setting two pieces of homework for parents this month –

- Sign up to Edmodo to get updates on what your child is up to in their class. This is a handy way for teachers to communicate with you quickly about learning activities, trips or help needed in each class.
- Ensure that you are registered with Squid (registration information coming out to new parents very soon) as this term we are working towards becoming a cash free school. It is hoped that from later in the school year, all payments will be made through squid, or at least the vast majority. This is to enable easier tracking of payments made, reduce time spent counting and handling money and generally improving the efficiency of office systems. If you are having any problems with squid, please speak to Lara in the office.

Any parent is welcome to join us on any Friday, you don't have to wait until your child is celebrating, but if you wish to do this, please check with the office first to ensure assembly is happening that day.

invite parents into school to spend time looking at their child's work. The children love to sit and go through their books, explaining what they have been learning. We strongly encourage parents to join us if at all possible, but understand that sometimes work/life commitments do not allow this. If you are unable to join us please let us know (especially with young children) and we will make sure that your child is actively engaged elsewhere in the school whilst the open session is

- taking place, thus minimising disappointment.
- Parent's evening We hold parents evenings twice a year to give parents the opportunity to have a focussed discussion with the class teacher about their child's learning and general school experience. Each appointment lasts 10 minutes. If you think that you need more than 10 minutes to discuss a particular issue, we ask that you make a separate appointment when needed, as teachers have many appointments to fit in each evening and overrunning causes inconvenience for other parents. The first parent's evenings will be in early November (see dates section) and we will write to you nearer the time with details of how to book appointments.

are always welcome to join us. We will be holding our HARVEST service later this term (see below for details) As has happened for the last few years, we ask children to bring in gifts of food for Family Support Network who work with local

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families in need of some help. Please send children in with your food gifts – especially tinned veg, soup and dried ingredients - on the morning of either Monday 8th or Tuesday 9th. Thank you.

• Productions – each year our children get an opportunity to take to the stage. In December our infants will be delighting you with our version of the Nativity and in July it will be the turn of our Junior pupils. You will receive more information nearer the time about costumes needed, lines to be learnt and tickets to be purchased, but please put the very important dates in your diary as soon as you receive them.

REMINDER

Pupil Premium

If you are on a low income making a FSM application can greatly benefit your child.

It is often thought that parents of children in KSı who currently receive Universal Free School Meals do not need to make a Free School Meals Application for the school to receive Pupil Premium. THIS IS NOT THE CASE.

Please read the linked information letter which explains that any accepted applications for Free School Meals (whether or not your child takes the meal up) attract £1320 per child per year which the school can use to greatly enhance the resources available for your child both within the classroom and for extra-curricular activities. We may be able to help with school uniform costs, trips and other extra-curricular activities like swimming and music tuition.
