#### Treasurer

The Treasurer is responsible for tracking and reporting the PTA's finances; this focuses on money-in from fundraising and money-out for investments. The Treasurer's main focus is on profit earned per event, paying invoices and managing the PTA bank account.

# Improvement areas this academic year

As always, we have written a targeted action plan for this academic year, to ensure that the school continues to develop and grow and offers the best possible provision for your children. This year, we are focussing on the following areas:

- Reviewing our long term curriculum map to ensure it reflects our vision and results in the positive impact that we are aiming for.
- Continuing the development of the planning and assessment of foundation subjects.
- Ensuring that all children leave us as confident readers.
- Further developing our pupils' emotional literacy.
- Continuing to improve attainment in writing.

### Census

The school receives funding from the government to pay for Universal Free School meals for all KS1 children (Reception, Year 1 and Year 2). This funding is calculated on how many children eat a hot lunch on census days twice a year. Census day this term is **Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> October**. Please could you encourage your child to eat a hot meal on this day to maximize our funding. If numbers are low on census day we do have to cover any shortfall from an already stretched school budget.

#### <u>Uniform</u>

All children should wear the correct uniform each day, including PE uniform and accessories.

Long hair must tied back and headbands and other hair accessories should be blue, white, grey or black; a small thing but it makes a big difference.

#### **Absence**

If your child is poorly and will not be coming to school, please ring us by 9 o clock if possible, leaving a message stating the reason for absence. Please do not email us with this information as the emails are not checked until later in the morning and sometimes this important information can get lost.

#### **Parking**

The car park at the side of the school is for staff use only between 8am and 4:30 pm and should not be used for parent, unless previously agreed by the school. Of course, if you have mobility issues please let us know and we can make separate arrangements.

#### Snacks at break-time

Please ensure that your child only brings in a fruit or vegetable snack at break-time.

#### <u>Nuts</u>

Remember we are a NO NUTS school – we have several children with severe allergies to various types of nuts, including pesto, hummus, Nutella and other lunch-time favourites! Please check ingredients carefully so that we don't have to upset any children!

# REMINDER

### **Pupil Premium**

If you are on a low income making a FSM application can greatly benefit your child.

It is often thought that parents of children in KS1 who currently receive Universal Free School Meals do not need to make a Free School Meals Application for the school to receive Pupil Premium. THIS IS NOT THE CASE.

Please contact the office if you think you may be eligible for Pupil Premium funding. Any accepted applications for Free School Meals (whether or not your child takes the meal up) attract over £1300 per child per year which the school can use to greatly enhance the resources available for your child both within the classroom and for extra-curricular activities. We may be able to help with school uniform costs, trips and other extra-curricular activities like swimming and music tuition.
