Modern Foreign Languages

Sadly, Madame Coulson, who taught French to Forest, Spring and Mill left us at the end of last term. This term, the children in Spring and Mill will be taught French on a Friday morning by Madame Cleere, who teaches languages at Ardingly College.

As the children in Forest class are learning about Spain this term, we will be pausing their French learning for a while, and they will be learning about the Spanish language. At Primary level, the curriculum for languages "should lay the foundations for further foreign language teaching at key stage 3" (National Curriculum 2014) and we have been offered an opportunity for some Ardingly College language students to come in and teach our pupils a little Spanish and something about the country and its people. I am sure that our children in Forest will really enjoy this.

Wellbeing and Wellington Boots

This is just a reminder that we ask all pupils to leave a pair of wellies in school. This is so that even when the grass is wet/muddy, our children can still play outside at playtimes. During the spring term, classes will also be taking part in some "wellbeing" afternoons and some of the activities may involve being outside on the field or in the wildlife area. REMINDER

Pupil Premium

If you are on a low income making a FSM application can greatly benefit your child.

It is often thought that parents of children in KS1 who currently receive Universal Free School Meals do not need to make a Free School Meals Application for the school to receive Pupil Premium. THIS IS NOT THE CASE.

Please contact the office if you think you may be eligible for Pupil Premium funding. Any accepted applications for Free School Meals (whether or not your child takes the meal up) attract over £1300 per child per year which the school can use to greatly enhance the resources available for your child both within the classroom and for extra-curricular activities. We may be able to help with school uniform costs, trips and other extra-curricular activities like swimming and music tuition.
