#### Dear Parents and Carers,

Throughout this year, we have been talking to the children about what makes a good learner and what great learning looks like in our school. Through lots of discussion, storytelling, reflection and even by thinking about baking cakes, we have agreed that the following best sums up what a good learner at Balcombe School does so well. Please discuss this and reinforce with your child at home when appropriate. They should be able to explain what a 5 star listener is and tell you how important mistakes are for learning.

### A Balcombe School learner ......

- Is a five star learner.
- Is prepared and respects equipment, surroundings and other people
- Is a kind and supportive team member.
- Always does his/her best.
- Embraces mistakes and knows that they are an important part of learning.

As part of this process, staff and governors have reviewed our behaviour policy and I attach that so you can remind yourself of the key messages. We have tried to keep our systems and procedures simple, with clear steps for dealing with unwanted, poor behaviour and ensuring that our responses to poor behaviour are consistent, reasonable and fair. The policy also describes how we reward consistent good behaviour and/or significant improvements. You will notice that our pupils are expected to behave well and be good ambassadors for our school on the journey to and from school, as well as whilst they are actually inside it..... in fact, at any time they are wearing school uniform.

#### Feedback and Marking policy

You may have noticed during the last "book look" session that we have changed the way we respond to your children's work. Current research has shown that children learn more from feedback when it is instant, verbal and bespoke to them, rather than generic comments written in their book which they do not see until at least the following day. With this is mind, we have been trialling marking in this way this year - speaking with individuals as they carry out a piece of work, highlighting areas that need correcting or improving and celebrating success in a more immediate way. By doing this, pupils are able to correct mistakes more quickly and have successful ideas reinforced. Sometimes, we might stop a lesson and correct a misconception with a group or the whole class, or highlight a successful strategy for example. We feel that, as the research suggests, our pupils learn better with this type of feedback, rather than long notes written when the pupils have gone home. Teachers still look in detail at the work after the lesson, but may only tick it to show it has been seen. Of course, looking at the books will still be used to help teachers plan the next steps for the following lesson.

I am attaching our marking and feedback policy for your reference and am happy to answer any questions you may have.

### Parking

Hopefully, the National Walk to School week, has inspired you to park a bit further away from school and walk the last part of the journey with your child/children. With that in mind, we have noticed that a few carers and grandparents are parking on Westup Lane. Please can you remind anyone dropping off and collecting that, for the safety of our community we ask that you do not park here, particularly at the beginning and end of the day to ensure everyone is safe.

# REMINDER

#### Pupil Premium

If you are on a low income making a FSM application can greatly benefit your child.

It is often thought that parents of children in KS1 who currently receive Universal Free School Meals do not need to make a Free School Meals Application for the school to receive Pupil Premium. THIS IS NOT THE CASE.

Please contact the office if you think you may be eligible for Pupil Premium funding. Any accepted applications for Free School Meals (whether or not your child takes the meal up) attract over £1300 per child per year which the school can use to greatly enhance the resources available for your child both within the classroom and for extra-curricular activities. We may be able to help with school uniform costs, trips and other extra-curricular activities like swimming and music tuition.
