Meet the Teachers

Meet the teacher sessions will take place early in September. End of year assessments

We are really proud of our assessment results this year –

- In EYFS we had 80% of pupils achieving a good level of development (GLD) compared to 68% nationally.
- In phonics 88% of our pupils reached the expected level compared to 80% nationally.
- In yr4 our multiplication check results showed that 8/13 pupils achieved full marks. This is 62% of pupils scoring full marks, compared to 34% national average.
- In yr 6, 74% of our pupils attained the expected level in Writing, Maths, Grammar Punctuation and Spelling, with 95% attaining this in Reading.

Drama Club - end of year update



Upper and Lower Drama club have been busy this year as always. The Upper Group started the year creating Drama around all sorts of periods of history they have learnt about in their classes - they were keen to cover Boudicca; the Great Fire Of London; Second World War; Greeks and Romans as well as modern subjects such as the Olympics and Computer worlds coming into reality. They moved on to devising their own performances which they scripted

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themselves and performed to parents and the school with great success in March. The idea was a 'Magic Library' where all the books came to life. Each group chose a different story - we had 'Star Wars', 'Matlda', 'Rapunzel' and a 'War Comedy'! In the summer term they have developed their skills of spontaneous improvisation as well as ways to create characters on stage, focusing on the fun of Pirates.









The Lower group started the year exploring all sorts of stories and acting them as a group through games and improvistation. We went from the Olympics, to 'Goldilocks'; 'Red Riding Hood'; Astronauts and Aliens; to 'The Nutcracker'; elves and The Nativity. After Christmas we explored the story of 'Town Mouse Country Mouse' before developing it into a script. The rest of the school loved their play and we toured it to Russettings Care home, which is always a treat for all concerned. In the Summer term we have had lots of fun with a water and sea theme, leading to Pirate Plays!

Pupil Premium

If you are on a low income making a FSM application can greatly benefit your child.

It is often thought that parents of children in KS1 who currently receive Universal Free School Meals do not need to make a Free School Meals Application for the school to receive Pupil Premium. THIS IS NOT THE CASE.


Please contact the office if you think you may be eligible for Pupil Premium funding. Any accepted applications for Free School Meals (whether or not your child takes the meal up) attract over £1300 per child per year which the school can use to greatly enhance the resources available for your child both within the classroom and for extra-curricular activities. We may be able to help with school uniform costs, trips and other extra-curricular activities like swimming and music tuition.
