

Pupil Premium Plan – Autumn 2017

Strategy for the use of Pupil Premium

The schools' pupil premium grant allocation is £3,960 for three pupils. The Ever 6 grant is £5,280.

Pupils who were previously CLA have been added to the PP funding from April 2017 £3,800.

The main barrier to educational achievement faced by eligible pupils is cognition and learning and ensuring academic progress is in line with peers. There are a range of needs including social and emotional needs, sensory/physical needs and communication and interaction needs. To address these barriers teaching assistants are allocated in class for 1:1 support as well as small group work. Resources are purchased to support individuals and small group work. The schools learning mentor works directly with pupils to address social and emotional needs. Class trips, clubs and music lessons are funded. Financial support with uniform is also offered.

Pupils' progress is measured termly to determine the impact of the pupil premium plan. Pupils are assessed to ensure appropriate progress and to determine whether they are on track to meet the age related expectation. Pupil progress meetings take place termly and more frequently for SEND pupils. Parent meetings and pupils view forms will measure the impact of the social and emotional intervention. There is a plan to administer the Boxall profile in Autumn 2017 to evaluate effectiveness of interventions.

This will be reviewed in December 2017 after the next collection of assessment data.
