Dear Parents,

Comic Relief. This year, Red Nose Day is on the 15<sup>th</sup> March. We have decided to keep it simple and ask the children to help us raise money in two ways.

- 1. Wear red to school. This can be normal clothes which are red, a full on fancy dress outfit which is red, or school uniform with a red scarf or even socks the choice is theirs. We do ask though that for the privilege of being able to wear red, each child brings in a donation of at least £1.

# **Enrichment Days**

A wide range of enrichment activities for children at Balcombe School is running throughout the year, with one-off events such as the Maths Challenge at Christ's Hospital, a Theatre Trip to see *The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe* and a Glider Competition (see below for details), plus a varied programme of sporting competitions and a series of workshops organised by the NEARS group. As part of this, Balcombe hosted a Gymnastics Workshop earlier this month, run by Mrs Smith. 'A total of 18 Year 5 and 6 girls and boys from our local schools attended a hugely successful morning of gymnastics.

The children enjoyed exploring and creating counter balances with a partner and then developed ideas to work in groups of three and four. Working together in larger groups required the children to collaborate with their new friends. To the music from The Greatest Showman, *This is Me*, (as chosen by the children) the gymnasts incorporated their balances into a wonderful display, showcasing their individual skills and group dance

movements. The children performed brilliantly and their attitude and effort was amazing. I felt privileged to work with such a great group of children.'

# REMINDER

#### **Pupil Premium**

If you are on a low income making a FSM application can greatly benefit your child.

It is often thought that parents of children in KS1 who currently receive Universal Free School Meals do not need to make a Free School Meals Application for the school to receive Pupil Premium. THIS IS NOT THE CASE.

Please read the linked information letter which explains that any accepted applications for Free School Meals (whether or not your child takes the meal up) attract £1320 per child per year which the school can use to greatly enhance the resources available for your child both within the classroom and for extra-curricular activities. We may be able to help with school uniform costs, trips and other extra-curricular activities like swimming and music tuition.
