

Breakfast Club Q&A

For me, after school care would be more useful than before school. Perhaps worth considering both options?

We are looking to roll out breakfast club first; if this is successful we will then look into an after school club.

With the breakfast club I think discount should be offered if more than 1 child is attending.

A sibling discount of 50p will be offered.

It would work if we could use kids vouchers to pay for it.

We will accept child care vouchers.

I would need confirmation that this will be long term, if I give up my alternative morning provision.

We are committed to running the club for a minimum of one academic year. If the club is successful and not running at a loss this service will continue to run.

Minimum of £4 a child seems very high compared to other schools. It is unclear from the above how long the session would be and whether it would include a snack/breakfast so it is difficult to say what cost would be reasonable.

We have researched similar breakfast clubs and feel we are competitive. Prices are for bookings made in advance. Ad-hoc spaces will be available for an extra £1 per session and still require 1 weeks' notice.

7.45 start £4 Includes Breakfast

8 Start £3 No Breakfast

Children will have a selection of different breakfasts including toast, bread, crumpets and cereals.

It would be helpful to know how early the breakfast club would start. This would also dictate how useful it would be.

We are looking to start at 7.20

I would really welcome the opportunity to use this facility on an ad hoc basis but covering any day of the week, depending on work needs.

We will be able to offer ad-hoc places subject to numbers already booked. Ad-hoc spaces will be available for an extra £1 per session and still require 1 weeks' notice.

Breakfast depends on food/allergies.

We will ensure that any medical plans / allergies are followed in the same way as during school times.
