Dear Parents/Carers,

As we rush towards the end of January, I thought it was a good time to give you a few updates about key projects in school.

Additional Funding

The government have recently awarded schools additional funding to be used to ensure that we minimise the impact of covid as much as possible in relation to our pupils' learning. This funding, in the form of two grants - School led tutoring and Recovery Premium, is aimed at supporting our most vulnerable pupils and those most affected by the disruption to schooling. Being a small school, with very little deprivation, the amount that we have received is small compared to some other local schools, but we have decided to use it to release teachers in some classes for a period of time each week, to enable them to work with individual or small groups of children. They will be providing short bursts of bespoke, targeted teaching, aiming to fill in some of the gaps in missed learning.

Nature Ninjas

Work on the site has halted until the ground dries out, at which point the machinery needed will be able to gain access and start moving soil and marking out paths. Once this has happened and the site is safe, we will look to begin using the space with children.

As you are aware, we ran a competition last term to design a logo for our new initiative. Congratulations to our 5 winning pupils, (Anna, Martha, Joseph, Izzy and Reece) who created stunning designs for a new Nature Ninjas logo. Their designs were singled out for impact, imagination and relevance. Unfortunately we couldn't have all 5 deigns, but have amalgamated 2 to make the final logo. Huge thanks go to Christina Futcher — Law for producing this for us.

Parking

We have been asked by a local resident to ".....ask for your consideration regarding parking on the Haywards Heath road leading down from the pub to the school.

REMINDER

Pupil Premium

If you are on a low income making a FSM application can greatly benefit your child.

It is often thought that parents of children in KS1 who currently receive Universal Free School Meals do not need to make a Free School Meals Application for the school to receive Pupil Premium. THIS IS NOT THE CASE.

Please contact the office if you think you may be eligible for Pupil Premium funding. Any accepted applications for Free School Meals (whether or not your child takes the meal up) attract over £1300 per child per year which the school can use to greatly enhance the resources available for your child both within the classroom and for extra-curricular activities. We may be able to help with school uniform costs, trips and other extra-curricular activities like swimming and music tuition.
