Some important information for you....

Reading Homework

We want children to develop or continue a love of reading. As part of their homework, your child should read at home every day. We cannot stress how important this is, no matter what their reading ability. Put time aside every day to share and talk about books together. Enjoy discussing the books you read, commenting on characters, setting and structure. Encourage the children to read to the punctuation and to read with expression. Evidence shows that children who regularly share books with adults at home develop more fluency in reading, better comprehension skills and more enjoyment from texts. This not only improves reading confidence and skills for later life but leads to greater achievement in writing.

We are always keen for parent volunteers to come and listen to children read in school. If you feel that you could give up some of your time to help out, this would be greatly appreciated.

Homework

In addition to reading daily, children are expected to complete the following:

- Read at least 5 times a week to an adult with evidence recorded in the reading record.
- Weekly revision/learning of times tables & division facts (see stars in homework books for the times tables journey). (Y3 from Autumn Term, Y2 from Spring Term).
- Weekly spellings will be assessed in class at the back of the homework book and sent home for you to see your child's progress.
- Each half term Y3 children should complete two activities from the current homework topic grid located in their homework book. (Optional for Y2)

Weekly homework will be set on a **Friday** and homework books should be returned by the following **Thursday**. Children will be assessed on their times tables/division facts on a **Tuesday** and their spellings on a **Thursday**.

Topics

Our topic for the first half of the Autumn term is 'Sticks, Stones and Bones'. We also like to keep some topics a surprise....so watch this space for up and coming topics!
