Did you know ... just registering your child for Free School Meals means that the school gets extra money to support your child, whether they have a meal or not!

Register now to make sure your child and the school don't miss out

The Government is giving money to schools to help children from lower income families do their very best. This funding is called a 'Pupil Premium'.

For every child registered Balcombe School is given £1320 into its budget.

We do not receive the additional funding unless you apply even though KS1 children are already provided with a free meal. If you receive any of the benefits listed, registering could bring extra income to help the school provide additional support and financial help for your child.

Please register as soon as possible to make sure your child and others in their class don't miss out.

How does it work?

- 1. First, check if you qualify it is not just if you are unemployed, so please look at the list below.
- 2. Registering is really quick and easy if you think you qualify, apply online via the WSCC web site using the link below:

West Sussex County Council: Free school meals

- 3. If you want your child to have a free, healthy meal at lunchtime that's great they will get the free meal (saving you money) and the school gets £1320 extra.
- 4. If you don't want your child to have the school meals they can continue as normal as long as you qualify and are registered, the school *still* gets £1320 extra.

Registration is confidential and it will not affect any other benefits you are claiming. If you need help, please speak confidentially to Lara Power, the school Bursar.

Do you qualify? You can register your child for Free School Meals if you get any of these benefits:	
Income Support	 Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
 Income-related Employment and Support Allowance 	Working Tax Credit 'run-on'
 Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999 	Universal Credit
Child Tax Credit (with no working tax credit) and an annual income (as assessed by HM Revenue & Customs) that does not exceed £16,190	The Guarantee element of State Pension Credit
